The following Act of the Andhra Pradesh Legislature received the assent of the Governor on the 16th August, 1976 and the said assent is hereby first published on the 17th August, 1976 in the Andhra Pradesh Gazette for general information:—

## ACT No. 43 OF 1976.

An Act to establish and incorporate a teaching and affiliating University for certain areas in the State of Andhra Pradesh and to provide for matters connected there with or incidental thereto.

BE it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Andhra Pradesh in the Twenty-Seventh Year of the Republic of India as follows:—

### CHAPTER (

## PRELIMINARY

(1) This Act may be called the Nagarjuna University short title

- 2. In this Act, and in all statutes, ordinances and regu- pelliptions lations made hereunder, unless the context otherwise requires,—
- (†) "academic year" means a period of twelve months commencing on the 1st day of July of the year or such other period of twelve months beginning on such date as the Syndicate may specify in respect of all the colleges under the control of the University or any particular college thereof;
- 21 "affiliated college" means a college located within the University area affiliated to the University as providing courses of study qualifying students for admission to the University examinations in accordance with the regulations prescribed;
- (3) "autonomous college" impans; a college on which the status of autonomy has been conferred by the University;
- (4) "college" means a college established and maintained by, associated with, or affiliated to, or recognised by, the University;

- (5) "Department" means a Department of Studies of the University recognised as such by the statutes and includes a Centre of Studies;
- (6) "Director of Higher Education" includes a Joint Director in-charge of Higher Education;
- (7) "employee" means any person appointed by the University, and includes teachers and other staff of the University.
- (8) "Faculties" means the Faculties of the University as prescribed by the Statutes;

- (10) "hostel" means a unit of residence or corporate life for the students of the University, college or institution, providedy maintained or recognised by the University;

- (15) "recognised teacher" means a person working in any recognised institution or in any institution associated with the University recognised by the University for the purpose of imparting instruction or conducting research or both and designated as recognised teacher by the ordinances;
- (17) "statutes" "ordinances" and "regulations" means, respectively, the statutes, ordinances and regulations of the University for the time being in force;

- (18... "student" means a person who is admitted to a college and is born on the attendance register thereof until the end of the academic year;
- (19) "reachers of the University" meas professors, readers, lecturers and such other persons as may be appointed for imparting instructions or conducting research in the University or in any college or in any institution maintained by the University and designated as teachers by the ordinances;
- (20) 'University' means the Nagarjuna University as constituted under this Act;

## CHAPTER II THE UNIVERSITY

- 3. (1) There shall be constituted in and for the area comprising within a radius of twenty kilometres around Kaza-Nambur in Guntur district, a University by the name of the Nagarjuna University, which shall the Units consist of a Chancellor, a Vice-Chancellor, a Rector, if versity any, a senate a Syndicate and an Academic Council.
- (2) The headquarters of the University shall be at Kaza-Nambur in Guntur district and it may establish campuses at such other places, within its University area as it may deem fit.

- (b) The University shall be a body corporate having perpetual succession and a common seel, and shall sue and be sued by the said corporate name.
- 4. The objects of the University shall be to disseminate and advence knowledge, wisdom and understanding by providing instructional and research facilities in such branches of learning as it may deem fit and by the example and influence of its corporate life, and, in particular, to make special provisions or integrated courses in the humanities and the sciences in the educational programmes of the University and to take appropriate measures, for promoting interdisciplinary studies and research in the University.
- 5. 1) The University shall have the following Powers of powers and functions. namely::—

- If to provide for instruction in such branches of learning as the University may, from time to time, determine and/to make provision for research and/ for the advancement and/dissemination of knowledge:
- (ii) to grant subject to such conditions, as the University may determine, diptomas or certificates to, and confer degrees and other academic distinction on the basis of examinations; evaluation drany other method of

testing, on persons, and to withdraw any such diplomas, certificates, degrees other academic distinctions for good and sufficient cause;

- (iii) to organise and to undertake extramural studies and extension services :
- (iv) to confer honorary degrees or other distinctions in the manner prescribed by the statutes;

- (v) to provide instruction, for such courses of the factor study, including the course of study by correspondence, to such persons as are not members of the University, as it may determine:
- (vi) to institute professorships, readerships, lecturerships, principalships, and other teaching or academic posts required by the University and to appoint persons to such professorships, readerships, lecturerships, principalships, or other posts;
- (vil) to recognise an institution of highter learning for such gurposes as the University may determine and to withdraw such recognition;
- (viji to recognise persons working in any recognised institution or in any institution essociated with the University for importing instruction or

supervising research or both, and to withdraw such recognition:

- (ix) to appoint persons working in any other university college or organisation as teachers of he university for a specified period.,
- (x. to create administrative, ministerial and other) posts and to make appointments thereto.,

- (xx) to make such special arrangements in respect of mowen students as the University may consider designable;
- (xxi) to regulate and enforce discipline among the teachers and other employees and students of the University and take such disciplinary measures in this regard as may be deemed by the University to be necessary;
- (xxii) to make arrangements for promoting the health and general welfare of the teachers and other employees.
- (xxiii) to receive donations and to acquire, held manage and dispose of any property, movable or immovable, including trust and endowment properties for the purposes of the University;
- (xxiv) to borrow, with the prior written approval of the Government, on the security of the property of the of the University, moneys for the purposes of the University;

(xxv, to institute and manage publication bureau, employment bureau, and University extension boards;

(XXVI) to do all such other acts and things as may be necessary, ignidential or conducive to the atlainment of all or any of the objects of the University.

- (2) No college or institution affiliated to or associated with or recognised or maintained by any other University in the University area of this University shall be affiliated to or associated with or recognised by the Nagarjuna University for any purpose except with the prior approval of the Government, and the concerned University and the management of the college or institution concerned.
- (3) Nothing contained in sub-section (1) shall be deemed to prevent the Government from issuing such orders as they may deem fit in regard to the levy of fees and the charges for admission of students to colleges under the management of the Government and the salaries of teachers in such colleges.
- (6) The University shall be open to persons of University either sex and whatever race, creed, caste, or class, open to all and it shall not be lawful for the University to adopt or classes, impose on any person any test whatsoever of religious castes, belief or profession in order to entitle him to be admitted and herein, as a teacher or student, or to hold any office creeds therein, or to graduate there at or to enjoy or exercise any privilege thereof:

Provided that nothing to this section shall be deemed to prevent the University from making special . . . .

provisions for admission of students of the weaker sections of the people and, particular, of the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes

- an inspection to be made, by such person or persons as inspection to be made, by such person or persons as inspection they may direct, of the affairs and properties of the University, its buildings, laboratories, libraries, museums, workshops and equipment, and of any college or institution maintained by or affiliated to, or recognised by the University, and also to cause an inquiry to be made, into the teaching and other work conducted or done by the University, or in respect of any matter connected with the University. The Government shall in every case give notice to the University of their intention to cause such inspection on infibity to be made and the University shall be entitled to be represented thereat:
- (2) The Government shall forward to the Vice-Chancellor a copy of the inspection report for obtaining the views of the Syndicate, and on receipt of such views, the Government may under such advice as they consider necessary and fix a time-limit for action to be taken by the University.
- 13) The Government may, where action has not been taken by the University within the time fixed to their setisfaction, efter considering any explanation furnished or representation made by the Syndicate, issue such directions as they may think lit, and the University shall comply with such directions.

- 2 The Vice-Chancellor shall be the principal executive and academic officer of the University, and shall exercise general supervision and control over the affairs of the University and give effect to the decisions of all the authorities of the University.
- (3) The Vice-Chancellor may, if he is of opinion that immediate action is necessary on any matter, exercise any power conferred on any authority of the University by or under this Act and shalf report to such authority the action taken by him on such matter;

Provided that if the authority concerned is of opinion that such action ought not have been taken, it may refer the matter to the Chancellor whose decision thereon shall be final;

Provided further that any person in the service of the character that university who is aggreed by the action taken by the Vice-Charcellor under this sub-section shall have the right to appear against a such vaction to the Syndicater within three months from the date on which decisions on such action is communicated to him and thereupons the Syndicate may confirm, modify or reverse the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor.
